In case you missed it...

Vermilion Baby Bundle has arrived!

August 15, 2024- Abbeville, Louisiana: The Vermilion Early Childhood Network has announced the Vermilion Baby Bundle is officially available to families in Vermilion Parish. This project is funded through grant dollars provided by the Louisiana Department of Education to improve child wellness and support approaches to learning.

The bundle is packaged in a diaper bag and includes:

- infant and child friendly books to promote literacy,
- a child safe swaddle to promote safe sleeping,

- baby blanket and knit cap provided by Steps to Heaven
- · infant toy and teething ring to inspire curiosity and promote problem solving,
- durable plastic document folder for the child's birth certificate and other vital records,
- informational pamphlets and flyers on: developmental milestones, quality childcare and early learning centers, Abbeville General Hospital services, and Early Steps services for children falling behind on developmental milestones,
- toddler sized T-shirt,
- and a custom mother's bracelet set.

The Vermilion Baby Bundle will be available through Abbeville General Hospital as an incentive for expectant mothers who complete the hospital's educational class at the halfway mark through their pregnancy. Expectant mothers can also complete an educational class with the Vermilion Women's Resource Center to receive a bundle.

The Vermilion Early Childhood Network is encouraging families to post pictures with their bundle and tag the network. New Addition to the Bundle!

The non-profit, *Steps to Heaven*, has generously donated a baby blanket and knit cap for EVERY Vermilion Baby Bundle! We want to thank this organization for providing these additional items for the bundles. Learn more below about the importance of these items for infants.

Knit Caps

Newborns are tiny and have difficulty regulating their body temperatures since the head is a significant source of heat retention or heat loss. By covering the top of an infant's head with a lightweight cap or beanie, hospital nurses help prevent sudden drops in the baby's body temperature. This keeps the baby healthy and comfortable. Additionally, infants in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) might need to wear hats with constant supervision to keep their body temperature warm.

Comfort Blankets

Studies have shown that babies who have a comfort blanket are more likely to feel a sense of security and attachment to their caregiver. This attachment is important for a baby's emotional development and can have an impact on their ability to form healthy relationships later in life. Studies have also shown that babies who have a comfort object are more likely to adapt to new environments and situations, and are more likely to be able to self-soothe when they are upset or anxious. This is because the object provides them with a sense of familiarity and comfort, which helps to reduce stress and anxiety.




Upcoming Events and Deadlines for Childcare Partners



Your child's brain needs talk!



The research is clear, and it's reassuring: Talk builds babies' brains, but it's not something you have to do nonstop.



Try to find 25-minute blocks during the day when you can focus on talking with your child.



Avoid too much screen time when your child isn't interacting with anyone, or use TV time as an opportunity to talk about what's happening in the story they're watching.



Talk about what you're doing and thinking. Turn daily routines and activities into opportunities for talk.



Build more back-and-forth

Double down: each time you get one back-andforth exchange with your child, try to make it two!





Tune in and respond to what they look at, do, and say. Notice what your child is interested in and engage with them on that topic.

Avoid interrupting or appearing disinterested when your child tries to talk back to you or to get your attention.



LENA

Early talk shapes a child's life. LENA shapes early talk.

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Language and interactions are key to **noticing**, **expressing**, and **managing** feelings and emotions, and are an important part of developing social-emotional skills.

Infants

are **noticing** how everything



- and feelings.
- · Talk about what you are feeling.
- Model appropriate responses to emotions.

Preschoolers

are learning to **manage** their feelings and emotions.

- Model healthy ways to cope with strong feelings and emotions.
- · Support peer interactions.
- Regularly practice vocabulary and calming strategies.

Toddlers

are beginning to **understand** and **express** their feelings and emotions

- Identify and label emotions for you and them.
- Validate their feelings.
- Supply descriptive words to help children solve challenges and resolve conflict.


